Our Setting

Aims to:

- Provide high quality care and education for children below statutory school age:

Working together for your children

In our setting we maintain a high rtio of adults to children this helps us to:

- Give time and attention to each child
- Talk to the children about their interests and activities;
- Help children to experience and benefit from the activities we provide;
- Allow the children to explore and be adventurous in safety.





Our Curriculum

Within the nursery we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum, which covers Prime Areas:

- * Literacy
- * Physical development
- * Personal, social and emotional development

Specific Areas:

- * Literacy
- * Mathematics
- * Understanding of the World
- * Expressive arts and design

Each child is an individual; this means that they may have different interests and learn in a variety of ways. To encourage children to reach their full potential, we provide a variety of activities that are both adult lead and/or chosen by the children themselves, this is known as "In the moment planning".

In the moment planning allows staff to help the children develop in al areas, whilst also allowing them to explore and discover new experiences through their own chosen play activities.

We organise our sessions so that the children can choose from, and work at, a range of activities and, in so doing, build up their ability to select and work through a task to its completion.

The children are also helped and encouraged to take part in adult led, small and large, group activities which introduce them to new experiences and help them to gain new skills, as well as working with others.







Our Normal Routine

- 7:45am Nursery opens
- 8:00am Breakfast.
- 9:00am Pre-school sessions start.
- 9:15am Free play activities begin. Children have access to all areas of their rooms and the garden area. Snack bar is opened and children are encouraged to serve themselves their Chosen snack.
- 11:15am Tidy up time.

12:00pm Lunch time. Morning Pre-school children leave and afternoon Pre-school children arrive.

12:30pm Free play activities begin. Children have access to all areas of their rooms and the garden area. Snack bar is opened and children are encouraged to serve themselves their Chosen snack.

- 3:00pm Afternoon Pre-school children leave.
- 3:45pm Tea.
- 4:30pm Free play.
- 6:00pm Nursery closes.

Safety and General Rules

FEES

All fees are payable on the 1st. of the month one month in advance, and can be paid by cheque, standing order or cash.

Fees are non-refundable whether due to illness, holiday or other cause, as we will have reserved your child's place.

The Nursery is closed for Christmas week. Therefore fees are calculated on basis of 51 weeks/year.

One months notice is required for termination of attendance or to change attendance pattern.

An initial registration fee of £25.00 is required to secure your child's place, of which £15.00 is refundable on leaving the Nursery.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Please ensure all doors and safety gates are closed and be vigilant at all times regarding the children's safety.

All children must be protected by vaccination prior to acceptance. Any child suffering from a rash, sore throat, high temperature, discharge from eyes, diarrhoea or vomiting should not attend nursery until 48 hours after symptoms have subsided or after clearance by family GP. Intended absence must be reported to the Manager as early as possible.

Medication will only be administered if the medication form has been completed and signed.

The nursery must be informed of any change of person collecting a child and reserve the right to request identification.

Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the nursery premises.

The designated access and car parking area at the rear must be used and the approach road speed limit observed.

<u>GENERAL</u>

Parents/carers are requested not to allow jewellery, sweets or money to be brought into the nursery. Please ensure your child is dressed in suitable and comfortable clothes, (adequately identified), including indoor and outdoor shoes. Although aprons will be provided, the nursery cannot be held responsible for damage to clothing during messy play etc.

All fees are payable on 1st of the month in advance, and can be paid by cheque, standing order, cash or card. Full fees are payable for children absent due to holidays or sickness. The Nursery is closed one week at Christmas, therefore fees are based on a 51 week year. One month's notice is required for termination of attendance, change of attendance pattern or any services provided.

An initial registration fee of £25.00 is required to secure your child's place, £15.00 will be refunded on leaving the Nursery. To retain your child's place at the Nursery, fees must be paid. We receive nursery education funding for two, three and four-year olds; where funding is not applicable, then fees apply as below.
